PROMOTING THINKING DURING PLAY engaging with children

Help children to think deeper about the topics you're exploring by engaging with them during play! Use open-ended questions to challenge and develop children's thoughts and ideas about what they're learning. You could ask children:

- If you were a polar bear, how might you build a home in the snow to keep warm, can we make our own cave?
- How do animals like seals and penguins find food in the polar region?
- What would you wear and carry as a brave explorer to navigate the icy terrain?
- In the icy polar world, what sounds might you hear, like snow crunching, the wind whooshing, or ice cracking?

LINKING TO THE LEARNING BEHIND PLAY

EXTENDING PLAY: WHERE TO NEXT

extension ideas and prompts for continued inquiry





- Iceberg exploration: Freeze a block of water and add it to a tub full of water and allow children to explore and investigate what happens! Discuss buoyancy or introduce global warming.
- Polar bear cave! Get those engineering minds working and use what you can find as a team to build your own cave, consider ideas like balance, shelter and capacity.
- Use books and technology to explore and investigate the life of polar bears!
- Help children understand what polar regions are really like by watching educational videos such as:
