PROMOTING THINKING DURING PLAY engaging with children

Help children to think deeper about the topics you're exploring by engaging with them during play! Use open-ended questions to challenge and develop children's thoughts and ideas about what they're learning. You could ask children:

- What can you hear on our walk?
- What can you smell?
- How many different colours can we see on our walk, should we count them?
- How can we make sure we are caring for nature whilst on our walk?

You might find children engaging in the following learning outcomes from the EYLF:

- Learning Outcome 2.4.: Children become socially responsible and show respect for the environment
- Learning Outcome 4.2: Children develop a range of learning and thinking skills and processes such as problem solving, inquiry, experimentation, hypothesising, researching and investigating

EXTENDING PLAY: WHERE TO NEXT







- Encourage children to consider how they care for the world through exploring sustainability practices, such as recycling, repurposing and reusing to reduce waste.
- Keep discovery resources and clipboard for note taking readily available for children in the outdoor space to encourage curiosity in nature.
