12-inch Balloons

HOW TO:

These Easter Egg Yarn Garlands are a fun, messy and beautiful decoration your kids will love making. Mix up your wool colours to create a stunning effect.

1. Blow up your balloons until they are about 6 inches tall. Because you haven't filled them, they will have a slight egg shape. Don't blow them up too big or you will use a LOT of the Mod Podge and yarn.
2. Cover the balloon with the Mod Podge using the sponge brush.
3. Use the yarn straight off the roll and tie a little bit to the balloon knot on top to anchor it. Wrap the yarn all around the balloon, making any design you like.
4. When you feel you have wrapped it enough, cut the end of the string and wrap it under another piece. It will look very messy - this is normal and part of the fun!
5. Dip the sponge in the Mod Podge and generously dab it all over the string, making sure to cover it really well. Soak it so there are no dry pieces of yarn.
6. Let dry for about 24 hours. It needs to be REALLY DRY when you pop the balloons, or the yarn will lose its egg shape.
7. Pop each balloon using a pin or scissors, then remove the balloon pieces from the egg. It might be tricky to separate the balloon from the yarn, so the egg might lose a bit of its shape. Don't worry if this happens, just place your finger in a gap and gently shape it back into an egg from the inside.
8. Tie each egg to a long piece of the yarn to make a garland and hang it wherever you like. We have ours in our foyer to greet our guests. Enjoy!
